# **Geaux Teach Ag Leadership Development Event**

#### **Purpose:**

To encourage FFA members to explore agricultural education as a potential career field and to provide members with an introduction to the basic skills necessary for a career as an agricultural educator.

### **Objectives:**

- 1. To encourage students to pursue a career in agricultural education.
- 2. To develop students' ability to prepare a lesson plan.
- 3. To develop students' abilities to teach effectively to achieve student learning.
- 4. To develop students' abilities to assess for student learning.

#### **Event Format:**

The Geaux Teach Ag Leadership Development Event (LDE) consists of three phases:

- *PHASE I* Participants organize, prepare, and write a lesson plan.
- PHASE II Participants teach their lesson to a panel of judges.
- PHASE III Judges ask the participant questions related to the lesson plan and/or lesson presentation.

## **Rules and Regulations:**

- 1. All Louisiana FFA Leadership Development Event (LDE) general rules apply except as indicated in the specific rules of this LDE.
- 2. The top four competitors from Sub-District and District competitions will move on to the Area competition. The top two competitors from Area will advance to the State competition. Revised 2019
- 3. The Geaux Teach Ag Leadership Development Event will be open only to students regularly enrolled in an agricultural education program during the current calendar year, or who are still in high school, but have completed all the agricultural education courses offered; they must be active members of chartered FFA chapters in good standing with the State Association and the National Organization.
- 4. All contestants will use the LSU lesson plan format. (Adopted 2020)
  - Any other lesson plan template will not be scored.
  - 1. <u>Topics</u>: Each year a new agriculture content area will be chosen from a rotating list and selected in this order:
    - Agribusiness
    - Agricultural leadership
    - Agricultural mechanics
    - Animal science
    - Natural resources and conservation
    - Plant science

- 2. Contestants <u>must</u> choose a topic identified in the state course outlines or framework that can be retrieved from the Louisiana FFA website within the respective content area identified for competition that year. Official judges of any Geaux Teach Ag Leadership Development Event shall disqualify a contestant if he or she teaches a topic outside of the content area chosen for that particular year. The topic designated for the year will be published online on the Louisiana FFA website
- 5. The lesson plan MUST include:
  - 1. Interest approach (including, link, motivation and overview)
  - 2. At least one objective
  - 3. Outline of teaching presentation
  - 4. Checking for comprehension (questions used to provoke thought immediately after objective is taught)
  - 5. Closure (recap of lesson)
  - 6. An assessment tool (written quiz questions) should be attached to the lesson plan but should NOT be a part of the teaching presentation. (Revised 2023)

Contestants are encouraged to use any combination of strategies that promote learning, such as (but not limited to) discussion, demonstration, guided practice and/or group work.

- 6. The teaching presentation will include delivery of:
  - A. An interest approach (i.e., link, motivation, and overview of the lesson),
  - B. Communication of the lesson objective,
  - C. Content delivery (including technical skills, teaching methods, checking for comprehension, questioning)
  - D. Checking for comprehension using non-formal methods, NOT a written quiz (Revised 2023)
  - E. Modeling ideal behaviors
  - F. Lesson closure.

The assessment tool that is included in the lesson plan will NOT be delivered during the teaching presentation.

- 7. A list of information sources (i.e., textbooks, websites, magazines) <u>MUST</u> be included as part of the contestant's lesson plan.
- 8. Each contestant must bring their own instructional tools and materials (i.e., handouts, posters, flipchart, visual aids, etc.). Only a laptop, digital projector and demonstration table will be provided in the presentation room. Internet is not guaranteed to be available.
- 9. Members are required to wear official dress at all levels of competition.
- 10. <u>Time Limit:</u> Each lesson shall be a minimum of twelve (12) minutes in length and maximum of fifteen (15) minutes. Each contestant will be allowed an additional three (3) minutes to be asked questions by judges relating to his or her lesson. Contestants are to be penalized one (1) point per second on each judges' score sheet for being under twelve (12) minutes or over fifteen (15) minutes not including time for judges' questions. A clock will be provided in the contest room allow contestants to track their

time.

11. One timekeeper shall be designated who will record each contestant's time, noting any time penalties (i.e., under twelve (12) minutes or over fifteen (15) minutes).

#### 12. Scoring:

- 1. Total Gross Points of 200 will be multiplied by 5 giving a total possible of 1,000 points.
- 2. The Time Deduction will be subtracted from the Total Gross Points score of 1,000.
- 3. The contestant's Net Score will be the Total Gross Points minus Time Deductions. (1000-time deductions= Contestant's Net Score) (Adopted 6/18)

First Tiebreaker: Teaching Presentation

Second Tiebreaker: Lesson Plan Third Tiebreaker: Questions

- 13. Four competent and impartial persons will be selected to play the role of participating students for the duration of all contestants' teaching performances.
- 14. Three competent and impartial persons with agriculture teaching backgrounds will be selected to judge the LDE.
- 15. One week prior to the area and/or state LDEs and at the discretion of the area and/or state superintendent, contestants will submit a PDF copy of the lesson plans, which will be shared with judges prior to the event. The judges will read and grade the lesson plans on content and procedures, recording their judgement on the provided scoresheet. (Adopted 8/19)
- 16. Each judge shall formulate and ask questions after the contestant's teaching performance. Judges shall meet prior to the LDE to prepare and clarify the questions to be asked.
- 17. More information relative to the sub-regional, regional and national LDEs are found in Bulletin No. 4. Participants in these LDEs should familiarize themselves with all rules and regulations prior to submitting lesson plans, etc.
- 18. First place winners in any previous State Geaux Teach Ag Leadership Development Event are ineligible to compete in succeeding Geaux Teach Ag Leadership Development Events.
